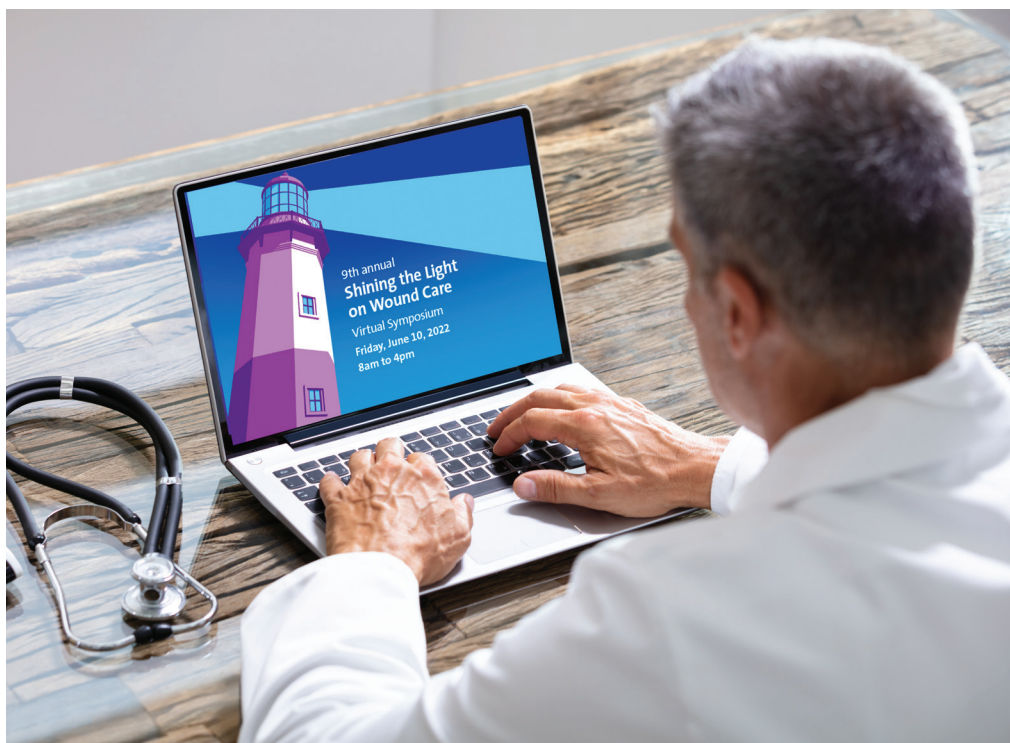

**Statement of need:** The term wound care encompasses many specific wound types and disease processes. Wounds occur due to underlying conditions in nearly every body system and is affected by the persons activity levels, lifestyle, and nutritional behaviors. New technologies and treatments are continually developed resulting in an inherent lack of awareness and underutilization of these products and technologies. This lack of awareness may lead to slower healing rates and poorer patient outcomes. Coupled with the multidisciplinary nature of wound care, practitioners tend to focus their educational opportunities on their specific specialty and not always receive updated information on wound care.

**Program objectives:** All Northwell Health CME activities are designed to improve patient care, safety and outcomes. At the conclusion of this conference, participants should be able to:
